GUIDELINES TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

It is mandatory to observe and follow the following rules and guidelines.

1. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is feeling unwell. A proper application or medical certificate must be submitted.
2. Parents must attend the PTMs on regular basis in order to keep a track on the progress of their ward. This is compulsory.
3. Parents must check the personal hygiene and cleanliness of their child/children.
4. Please inform the School Office in writing if there is any change in your address/ telephone numbers/office address etc.
5. Attendance on National festivals & School programmes day is compulsory.
6. Please check your ward's almanac daily and ensure that, the assigned homework is done on time and do countersign the remarks mentioned.
7. Any written communication that parents wish to make with the school should be made on A-4 sheet and must be addressed to the Principal.
E-mail is the most preferred form of communication.
8. As per CBSE guidelines, 75% attendance is mandatory to appear for school and board examinations.
9. Students should not bring any valuables to schools. School will not be held responsible for the loss of personal belongings.
10. All students are expected to join the school on the notified date at the beginning of the term.
11. The name, class & section of the pupil should be clearly marked on all belongings of the child. School will not be responsible for the lost materials.
12. Indisciplined behavior or misconduct by students, despite repeated warning and constant efforts by the staff to improve their behavior, will be expelled even at the time of final Examination. These types of cases will be judged by a Disciplinary Committee, appointed by the Principal.
13. Important messages are communicated, well in advance, through the students or through remarks of class teachers in their diary or through SMS. Students will be responsible for any misinterpretation of any rule of keeping the parents in the dark about the remarks given by the authority of the school.
14. Any child suffering from any contagious diseases will be sent back to home.
15. **During school hours phone call to the teachers are not allowed.**

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- 1) Students must be attentive, punctual, obedient, humble, regular & disciplined in school.
- 2) Punctuality and regularity in attendance is essential. Students who have been absent the previous day must bring a note of explanation through 'Non Attendance & Leave Record' page of the almanac without fail. In case of illness a medical certificate should be sent.
- 3) A student must speak in descent language all the time. He must ensure that his speech is courteous and polite.
- 4) English is second language for most of us, but it is also a medium of instruction. In order to acquire proficiency in spoken English, all students must compulsorily converse in English in school (and at home as far as possible).
- 5) A student must extend due courtesy and respect to all members of staff. Respect of elders and affection for juniors should be soundly inculcated. Every child is expected to uphold the name and honour of the school.
- 6) If a student is absent, it is his/her responsibility to complete his/her absence work. i.e., class work, home work, project work and all the academic work on time.
- 7) Students should carry sufficient stationary to avoid awkward situation. At the same time no expensive stationeries should be brought to the school.
- 8) Unacceptable behavior including irregular attendance, academic dishonesty and neglect of H.W., loitering and disrespectful behavior towards staff or fellow students will result in disciplinary action.
- 9) Proper queue must be maintained as and when required. The manner of movement should be quiet and orderly, at all times.
- 10) Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or is repeatedly or willfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in connection with examination has committed an act of serious indiscipline and/or misbehavior may be expelled permanently or removed from the school for a specific period by the Principal.
- 11) Anybody who organizes or takes part in unauthorized activities will be liable for disciplinary action.
- 12) Students must not bring & explode explosives/fire crackers at school. If students will be found indulged in such cases will be expelled from the school.
- 13) Long leave for marriages, functions, ceremonies etc will not be granted suddenly or at random. A **maximum of four days leave will be granted to a child in a session** under necessary circumstances. If applied for leave and sanctioned under unavoidable circumstances, the responsibility there after regarding the "**Progress of the child in his/her studies**" is to be that of the child or the parent. Parents should utilize full-scape paper for applying leave.
- 14) The child has to obey the instructions given by the Class Teacher/School. Disciplinary action will be taken if the child doesn't follow the instructions.
- 15) Beard is not allowed except for Sikh boys.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

2. Objectionable literature or expensive items.
3. Money, Cell phones, E-Games, Pen Drives, Cameras, Music Players, obscene materials etc.
4. Crackers, fireworks, fire arms and any other inflammable material.
5. Toys, any dangerous instrument, tobacco products, alcoholic drinks, chewing gum, banned food items.

LEAVE/ ABSENCE

1. Students who have been sick for more than five days have to bring a medical certificate from their doctor on the day of rejoining. A copy of certificate duly signed by the doctor must be submitted in the School Clinic for the follow-up:
Any student returning to school after suffering from any contagious disease will have to produce the doctor's fitness certificate.
 - Chickenpox: Till the scabs fall completely
 - Cholera Till the child is completely well.
 - Measles: One week after the rashes disappear.
 - Mumps Until the swelling has subsided.
 - Whooping Cough: Six weeks
2. All the students have to attend the school on the last working day before the vacation and on the reopening day after the vacation. Medical reasons will be entertained on very serious grounds like fracture or other serious illness.
3. It is compulsory for all the students to be present on the National festival days and the days of school functions. If absent disciplinary action will be taken.
4. Any student who remains absent from school for three or more successive days without prior information or leave granted their parents will be called.
5. It is compulsory for all the students to maintain 75% attendance during the course of the academic session to enable them to appear for the final examination. The percentage, however, could be relaxed on medical grounds by 10% at the most.
6. A special certificate will be given to the students having full attendance.
7. Leave with or without intimation/application will be considered as absent in all cases.
8. Half day leave are not given. Please don't apply for half day leave.
Incase of any planned reason, please take full day leave on that particular day.
9. Hosteller parents should drop their children at school before 6 PM on outing or reporting days.

A penalty of Rs. 500/- will be charged from those students, who remain absent on the School Functions/National Festivals (like 15th August, 26th January)/ the last working day before vacation/ the reopening day after vacation.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

The following disciplinary measures will be adopted by the school:

1. Oral warning and counseling.
2. Written warning/Intimating Parents
3. Suspension
4. Termination / Expulsion

The Principal/School Management retains the right to suspend or expel a student outright if the offence is of a very serious nature.



UNIFORM CODE

Wearing a uniform is a badge of pride, creates an identity for a school and is an important part of being a school student. Uniform gives students a sense of belonging to a particular school and create an identity for the school in the community. A school uniform teaches students to dress smartly and take pride in their appearance.

1. All students must wear only the prescribed uniform on all weekdays without making any alterations. Any alteration, if done without the permission will lead to disciplinary action.
2. Coloured dress is allowed only on birthday and when announced by the school.
3. Children's nails should be check regularly. Their hair should be cut according to school guidelines, and boys should trim theirs beards properly.
4. Tattoos, bangles, goggles, fancy pins etc are strictly not allowed to be worn in school.
5. No expensive accessories should be worn in school.
6. The Identity card and school uniform will be worn everyday and for all School Functions and activities.
7. Every year students have to get complete range of new uniform.
8. Vests should be worn compulsorily under the shirts.
9. Girls must wear cycling shorts (black/navy blue) under the skirt every day.
10. Girls having long hairs must tie their hairs in two plaits and no single pony is allowed in school.
11. Colouring of hair is not allowed in school.
12. All boys must keep their hair short, and should avoid making designs. No stylish hair cuts are allowed Beard are not permitted at all.
13. Sikh boys are supposed to wear black/blue coloured turban only, in school

Promotion Criteria except X and XII

1. Promotion to the next class is granted to the pupil on the basis of his/her overall performance during the academic session. The general criterion for promotion is that the student has grasped the subject matter of his/her present class sufficiently well to follow the syllabus of the next higher class.
2. A student will be promoted to the next class if she/he has cleared all the subject separately. Compartment will be given only in 02 subjects up-to Class IX and only in 01 subject in Class XI.
3. A clear pass will require 33% marks in each subject.
4. Students found using unfair means will not be considered in any case. He/She will be given zero in that subject and no re- test will be held.
5. 80% of attendance is essential failing to which the child will be deprived of appearing for the Annual Examination, whether school conducted or board conducted.
